## Take proactive steps to expedite projects: CS tells field officials

## Directs stringent action against habitual trouble makers

ITH a view to expediting various rail, road, coal and power projects in State, Chief Secretary GC Pati today directed field level Forest and Revenue officials to take proactive steps.

He also directed stringent action against habitual trouble makers who attempt to stall work under some or other pretext.

The directive of Pati came during a review of the Project monitoring Group of Cabinet Committee which met at the State Secretariat to take stock of the ongoing Railway, National Highway, coal mine, steel and power generation projects in State.

The project proponents were advised to take possession of land already handed over to them so that further encroachment does not take place and ensure project implementation, fulfilling rehabilitation commitments and Corporate Social Responsibility obligations.

Around 40 projects were reviewed and the issues raised by project proponents were resolved at the meeting. The

Forest and Environment Department was directed to identify 10,000 hectare of degraded forest land and keep these in land bank for compensatory afforestation against the forest diversions done for railway, national highway and coal mine projects.

Chief Secretary directed Forest Department to move to Centre for constitution of regional forest and environment committee for quicker decision on diversion proposals.
